### Dodds Seeks Demo Nod for Sec. of State

DANVILLE—State Sen. Robert R. Dodds (D-Danville) announced Thursday that he will seek the Democratic nomination for secretary of state in the September primary.

"I have decided to seek this office because I believe that my twelve years of experience as an Iowa legislator can bring sound judgment to the executive council and also to the administration of the statutory duties performed by the secretary of state."

Dodds, 43, was first elected to the Iowa house of representatives in 1956 and served until 1962 when he was elected to the Iowa senate. He was re-elected in 1966 to a four-year term. During the 1965 session of the legislature, he served as chairman of the governmental affairs committee and also as a member of the industrial and human relations and ways and means committees. During the 1967 session he served as chairman of the commerce committee and as a member of the industrial and human relations and ways and means committees.

Dodds, married and the father of five children, owns and operates a farm outside of Danville.
