

NEW YORK (A) - Investigators face the problem of figuring out how a band of hijackers plans to dispose of five million dimes-a shipment weighing more than 12 tons.

The gang of at least three thieves seized the \$500,000 shipment in a Railway Express Agency truck near Fort Lee, N.J., at gunpoint Wednesday,

The shipment of newly minted dimes in 500 sacks was enroute from the U.S. Silver Depository at West Point, N.Y., to the Federal Reserve Bank in Oklahoma City. The driver Charles Depew, 52, of Newburgh, was released at about 4 p.m. Wednesday near the town of Esopus, about 75 miles north of New York. He flagged


