

February 2024 Weather Summary

No significant cold snaps this February with temperatures averaging slightly above climate normal. High winds and mountain snow led weather headlines this month, with the windiest days being Feb 7 and 27. The snowiest day occurred on the 10th when a winter storm system moved across much of New Mexico. Light snow was even recorded in Las Cruces. Mountain snowpacks improved further this month, with monthly snow totals 6-10" at Silver City and 18-24" over the Sacramento Mountains. Conditions are looking more favorable for active Spring snowmelt.

The final week of February was well above normal, with daily records highs broken on the 25th. A quick-hitting upper low brought widespread precipitation on the 28th, notably recording thunder and ice pellets at El Paso overnight.

Precipitation totals were at or slightly above normal for this typically dry month.


February 2024 Weather Summary

Looking ahead to March, temperatures continue to warm as we reach the Spring Equinox and pass it. The average high temperature at El Paso on the first is 67 degrees, climbing to 76 degrees on the last day of the month. Daylight increases from 11 hours, 32 minutes March 1st to 12 hours, 30 minutes on the 31st. Daylight Savings Time begins the morning of March 10th. Looking at the moon, the new moon occurs on the 10th and the full moon, also known as the Worm Moon, occurs on the 25th. A penumbral lunar eclipse will occur on the 24th, however all eyes are set on next month's total solar eclipse.





































Feb 29 Fog Sacramento Mtns






ENSO Alert System Status: El Niño Advisory is in effect/ La Niña Watch is also in effect


ENSO Alert System


- ► El Niño or La Niña Watch: Issued when conditions are favorable for the development of El Niño or La Niña conditions in the next six months.
- ➤ El Niño or La Niña Advisory: Issued when El Niño or La Niña conditions are observed and expected to continue.

ENSO Forecast

ENSO is in El Niño phase and is expected to last into spring before transitioning to neutral by the beginning of this summer; possibly back to La Niña by the end of summer.








With a La Niña pattern, a ridge of high pressure tends to build off the west coast of the U.S., blocking most of our Pacific winter storm systems. These storms tend to end up moving across the northern Plains and down to the southeastern part of the country. Of course it is important to remember that these patterns are only what typically happens and are not guaranteed to occur.

With El Niño, we often see the opposite pattern where the eastern Pacific ridge of high pressure is often weak or non-existent, allowing winter storms to sweep across the southern U.S. This typically will give the southwestern U.S. above normal precipitation.





Current drought conditionsand 3 month change









Snow Data Upper Rio Grande Basin as of February 29, 2024




Snow Data Upper Rio Grande Basin as of Jan 31, 2024




Snow Water Equivalent as of February 29, 2024 Compare to last few years and average values





Precipitation for the Water Year Oct 1 - Feb 29, 2024 Compare to last few years and average values







Temperature and precipitation data for February 2024 in El Paso









Temperature and Precipitation Year-to-date for 2024 for El Paso




February 2024 rainfall estimate with surface rainfall reports



February 2024 rainfall estimate percent of normal




Radar rainfall estimate percent of normal for the Water Year (Oct 1 – Feb 29)









Temperature and precipitation outlook for Mar-May 2024




Temperature and precipitation outlook for Jun-Aug 2024






