

2018 Summer Student Intern Announcement - CWSU Nashua

The National Weather Service's (NWS) Center Weather Service Unit (CWSU) in Nashua NH is now accepting applications for our Volunteer Summer Student Intern Program. The CWSU is located at the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Air Route Traffic Control Center in Nashua. Two (2) positions will be available this year, starting in late May and continuing through early August. These are unpaid positions.

Background:

- This volunteer program gives students the opportunity to learn about NWS careers by gaining valuable on-the-job experience.
- Students can earn academic credit if approved by their academic institution.

Eligibility:

- Currently enrolled undergraduate or graduate students (half-time or more) majoring in meteorology or atmospheric science.
 - Undergraduate students must have completed their sophomore or junior year.
- Applicants must be U.S. citizens and are required to complete security and background investigations for both the FAA and the NWS.

Volunteer Duties:

- Shadow forecasters on the job and learn and perform the basic operational (briefing) duties of the CWSU. The average work week will be 10-20 hours per week.
- Work on a project that has some operational or training utility to the CWSU.
 - Potential 2018 projects include research on BOS Seabreeze and Stratus events.
- Potential job shadows with the NWS Weather Forecast Office and Northeast River Forecast Center, both in Norton MA.

How to Apply:

- Complete application packages will consist of a letter of interest, a resume highlighting your skills and interests in meteorology, and a copy of your college transcript(s). Unofficial transcripts are acceptable.
