Definitions for EXTREME COLD

WIND CHILL is what the temperature feels like based on both air temperature and wind speed

WIND CHILL ADVISORY: Dangerous wind chill readings **expected**

- Wind Chill reading 20 to 29 degrees below zero
 - In eastern New York: Herkimer, Hamilton, Warren, Fulton, Montgomery, Saratoga, Washington, Schenectady, Albany and Rensselaer counties
 - Southern Vermont

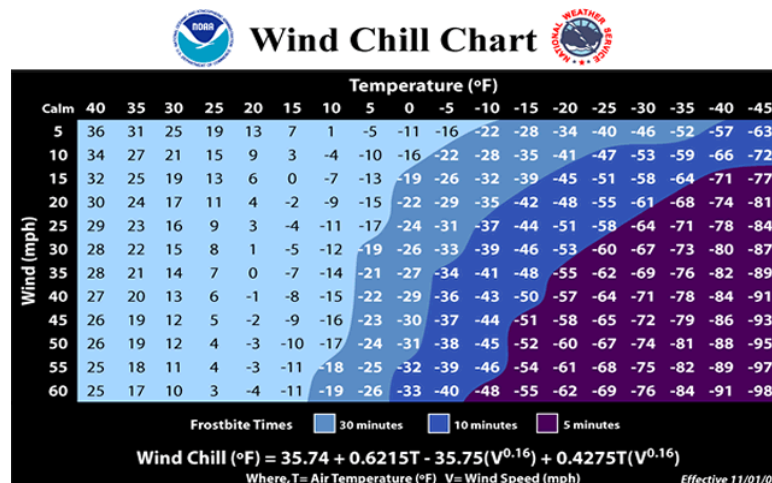
- Wind Chill readings 15 to 24 degrees below zero
 - In eastern New York: Greene, Columbia, Ulster and Dutchess counties
 - Berkshires
 - Litchfield County

WIND CHILL WATCH: Life-threatening wind chill readings **possible**

WIND CHILL WARNING: Life-threatening wind chill readings **expected**

- Wind Chill readings 30 degrees below zero or lower
 - In eastern New York: Herkimer, Hamilton, Warren, Fulton, Montgomery, Saratoga, Washington, Schenectady, Albany and Rensselaer counties
 - Southern Vermont

- Wind Chill readings 25 degrees below zero or lower
 - In eastern New York: Greene, Columbia, Ulster and Dutchess counties
 - Berkshires
 - Litchfield County

Definitions for EXTREME COLD

DRESSING FOR COLD WEATHER

adding layers will help keep you warm as the temperature drops

CHILLY

- 1-2 layers
- long layer
- outer layer to keep out wind, rain
- warm shoes water proof

COLD

- 2-3 layers
- gloves
- 1-2 layers
- warm hat
- outer layer to keep out wind, wet snow
- boots water proof

EXTREME COLD

- 3+ layers
- 1 insulating
- gloves
- 2+ layers
- warm hat
- face mask
- outer layer to keep out wind
- boots water proof

DON'T FORGET YOUR PETS
