
NEW Highlights

- → Another round of thunderstorms expected this afternoon.
- → Storms will be capable of producing very heavy rain with an isolated flash flood threat.
- → Damaging winds and hail possible in the strongest storms today.
- → Lower rain chances over the weekend, but heat index values return to the low 100's on Sunday and Monday.






National Forecast - Today



Weak trough over the area remains the focus for shower and thunderstorm development this afternoon. Heavy rain and damaging winds possible.




National Forecast - Friday



Another day with showers and thunderstorms expected; temperatures near normal.




National Forecast - Saturday



Temperatures warming up with rain chances decreasing this weekend. A few pop up showers and storms expected.





The heat returns for Sunday into Monday, followed by another uptick in showers and thunderstorms early next week.





Severe Weather Outlook

Day 1 - Today

Timing



Thunderstorms likely to start 1-3 pm, becoming more widespread by 3-5 pm.

Severe Threats




Damaging Wind

Potentially up to 60 mph with broken tree limbs and isolated power outages.




Up to 1" (quarter size) in the strongest storms






Precipitation Accum - Next 3 Days



After heavy rain occurred on Wednesday, there is potential for an additional 0.5"-1.5" of rainfall across the area over the next 3 days. Locally higher amounts likely.



Rainfall Forecast Today





There is a slight risk for excessive rainfall leading to flash flooding for the northern portion of the forecast area today, including the Columbia metro.
