





Was there significant weather observed (or being forecasted)?: Yes

Weather Details: Temperature of 98F, Parking lot Heat Index of 100 to 104F West Stands HI of 100 to 104F East Stands, in full sun and shielded from sea breeze, 104 to 108F Plume from any incident would travel toward the N and NW and with a dispersion index of 22 to 30 would hover near the ground. Safest approach for first responders would be from the SE.

Are you aware of any decisions made or plans changed due to your forecast?: Extra cooling busses. Fans allowed to bring in one bottle of water each Jacksonville Fire-Rescue has declared a Mass Casualty Event (MCE) and added extra medical personnel and ambulances. Jacksonville Sheriff's Office officers have been given information on signs of heat related illnesses in order to intervene as early as possible. Constant communications from command centre with officers to ensure safety at all times.

Marine Accident/Incident Report

Office: WFO Jacksonville

Date / Time of Event: September, 8, 2019 2AM Location: St Simons Island Sound. GA

Fatalities: unknown Injuries: unknown.

Event Details: Initially aware via social media of marine incident of car carrier cargo ship severely listing. Weather likely Not a factor. Fire on board the ship Sunday morning as well. We were requested for spot forecast report about 9 am which we submitted to the EMA and NOAA officials. 20 people have been safely removed and 4 people remain unaccounted for on the M/V Golden Ray, a 656 ft vehicle carrier. Ship was built in 2017. Reports indicated the incident started around 2 AM Sunday morning.

Watches/Warnings/Advisories/Statements: Weather was benign early Sunday morning. Not advisories, watches, warnings, or statements in effect.

Decision Support Services: This is an ongoing incident. We have provided a spot forecast for the incident.

.DISCUSSION...

Initially southerly winds will shift to out of the east-southeast at about 1-2 PM this afternoon, reaching upwards of 10-15 mph sustained with gusts as high as 20 mph before weakening this evening and return to being out of the south dropping to below 10 mph. Heat index values are expected to reach up to 100 degrees for the Brunswick area, with Min RH values dropping to about 50%. Low dispersion values are expected over the southeast Georgia coast and nearshore waters.
















PTC 9 / Hurricane Humberto

Friday the 13th! (September 13th, 2019)









- PERFECT forecast, there is no such thing as a perfect forecast this early!
- Most Likely Time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds: Sunday 18:00 to Monday 06:00 EDT




- Structure and speed of forward motion at CPA will be key to local impacts.
- Track will shift, more likely to the east/more offshore.
- On this forecast track: 40 to 50 knots with gusts to 60 knots.
- More likely: 25 to 35 knots Gusts 45 knots in a narrow band.
- Tides:
 - .75 to 1' Above astronomical near Golden Ray site.
 - 1 to 1.5 feet above normal astronomical along Jekyll Causeway and west of Sidney Lanier Bridge.


^I The ROR vessel Golden Ray capsized off Brunswick, Georgia on the morning of September 8, 2019.

The vessel has an estimated 32,780 gallons of diesel fuel onboard. Vessel is just south of the #19 buoy on the entrance to St Simons sound in ~30 feet of water.

NOAA is providing a trajectory analysis of potential releases from the vessel during recovery efforts. Trajectories have been developed using tidal currents and climatological wind

data (from NWS).











Last Sections Being Removed, and the Sides Fall Out!
