Tropical storm strength wind gusts extended mainly across eastern Aroostook County. Heavy rainfall between 1 and 2.5 inches fell in a band from Connor down through the southern portion of the county. Most reported impacts were in the form of power outages, mainly in the southern portion of the county. One injury was reported when a tree fell through the windshield of a moving car. The driver had minor scrapes but the other 6 passengers were uninjured.

Tropical storm strength wind gusts were recorded across most of Hancock county. Peak winds of 55 mph were recorded around Sedgwick Ridge. Power outages peaked around 20% due to downed trees and powerlines. Widespread rainfall amounts between 2 and 4 inches were recorded across Hancock County. There were no reports of structural damage due to either flooding or high winds. Two marine incidents occurred just offshore: a rogue wave capsized a lobster boat, resulting in two injuries; and a commercial whale watch vessel broke its mooring, creating a HAZMAT incident that released 1800 gallons of diesel fuel into the ocean.

There was one report of water over a road in multiple places due to heavy rainfall.
