


- Isolated snow flurries will affect north Georgia and portions of the metro through Sunday evening



# Wind Chill ("Feels Like" Temperature) Monday Morning






# In effect from 1 AM through 12 PM Monday.






# \*\*Max Temps Tuesday may occur early - winter precip would "wet bulb" our temps lower as it falls

# \*\*Max Temps Wednesday could be colder than this IF wintry precip is falling or fell on Tuesday





# • Long duration cold event

- Past similar experiences show that problems begin after approximately 48 hours below freezing
- Almost ALL of Georgia could exceed this 48 hour threshold
- Protect the 4 Ps
  - Pets
  - Pipes
  - Vulnerable Populations
  - Plants

# Winter Storm Watch

# In effect from 10 AM Tuesday through 7 AM Wednesday



- Roughly along and south of a line from Carroll to Hall county


   Includes Atlanta Metro Area, Columbus, Macon, and Athens
- Periods of snow could become moderate to heavy at times, with total accumulations of 1-3 inches possible.
- Light sleet and ice expected to be confined to far south-central Georgia late Tues PM/Wed AM.
   Ice accumulations < 0.1 inch</li>
- Plan on slippery, hazardous road conditions, which could impact the Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning/evening commutes.
- Stay tuned for updates as this event takes shape!

     Potential Winter Storm Impacts

### Minor Impacts

- Expect a few inconveniences to daily life.
- Winter driving conditions. Use caution while driving.

### **Moderate Impacts**

- Expect disruptions to daily life.
- Hazardous driving conditions. Use extra caution while driving.
- Closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.

### **Major Impacts**

### Expect considerable disruptions to daily life.


- Dangerous or impossible driving conditions. Avoid travel if possible.
- Widespread closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.

### Extreme Impacts

- Expect substantial disruptions to daily life.
- Extremely dangerous or impossible driving conditions.
   Travel is not advised.
- Extensive and widespread closures and disruptions to infrastructure may occur.
- · Life-saving actions may be needed.





## Likelihood of Minor Impacts from WPC WSSI










# High-end / Low-end Snow Potential

Tuesday Snowfall - Boom / Bust Potential Remains

## **Reasonable Worst Case: 10% of seeing this much or more**





This event has a higher ceiling due to the dynamics in play for snow in the first place. It also means that there is the real possibility of seeing NOTHING at all (*although that chance is decreasing*)




# Southward shift compared to yesterday which keeps heavier snow in central/south GA


