April was warmer and drier than normal across northern Arizona. Through the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month, every day was warmer than normal with no precipitation. From the 16<sup>th</sup> to the end of the month, temperatures were closer to normal or even a bit below, with a couple of days of precipitation. The most significant precipitation fell on the 27<sup>th</sup>, when over 0.50" of liquid equivalent fell over many high terrain areas. Snowfall amounts of 1 to 4 inches were common above 6500 feet.
