MONTH IN REVIEW FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR JULY 2014

...TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION OVERVIEW...

Average monthly temperatures were slightly warmer than normal across northern Arizona, especially the overnight low temperatures. Higher terrain areas from the Mogollon Rim to the White Mountains and Yavapai County mountains received above normal rainfall. It was much drier across northeastern Arizona, where most places saw less than half the normal rainfall for July.

...SIGNIFICANT WEATHER...

July 6th Heavy Rain and Hail in Heber:

Around 6:00 PM MST, strong thunderstorms affected the Heber-Overgaard area. Rainfall amounts of 1.5 inches along with dime sized hail. Hail accumulated to 2 inches in depth, with street flooding reported.

July 8th Flooding and Extreme Hail Accumulation in East Flagstaff:

Thunderstorms developed over the east side of Flagstaff between 4 and 5 PM MST. These storms dumped torrential rain and incredible amounts of hail, with diameters ranging from pea size up to quarter size. Around 30 homes were flooded, with many streets impassable due to flooding and hail accumulation. Hail washed onto low spots in roadways, accumulating to 2 feet in some spots. City snow plows had to be dispatched to clear the roads.

July 23rd Record High at Page

The high temperature of 106 in Page broke the old record of 104 set in 1959.

July 24th Heavy Rain in Prescott and Flagstaff:

Spotters in Prescott reported 1.63" of rain between 930 AM and 11 AM MST. Street flooding was reported. A spotter in the Cheshire neighborhood in north Flagstaff reported 1.50" of rain around 530 PM MST, leading to local street flooding.

July 26th Severe Thunderstorm Wind near Camp Verde:

Strong thunderstorms moved across Yavapai county during the late evening hours of July $26^{\rm th}$. One of these storms produced a 64 mph wind gust around 1105 PM MST 5 miles east of Camp Verde.
