MONTH IN REVIEW FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR JUNE 2018


... JUNE TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION OVERVIEW ...

June was significantly warmer than average across all of northern Arizona, with many locations in the top 10 warmest Junes on record. Rain fell on only one or two days near the middle of the month as tropical moisture from decayed Hurricane Bud moved northward into the region. This brought near to above normal precipitation to some areas.
