MONTH IN REVIEW FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR NOVEMBER 2012


...TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION OVERVIEW...

High pressure prevailed across northern Arizona during nearly all of November. This resulted in significantly warmer than normal daytime temperatures, with near or slightly below normal overnight lows due to the dry air mass. The only precipitation for the entire month came on the $8^{\rm th}$ through the $10^{\rm th}$ as a strong and cold low pressure system moved across the state. Monthly precipitation across all of northern Arizona was well below normal.

... SIGNIFICANT WEATHER...

November 8th-10th: A strong storm system moved across the state. Rain showers began across the Mogollon Rim on the 8th as moisture moved in from the south. On the 9th, very strong winds developed across northeast Arizona ahead of the approaching cold front. Winds gusted to 63 mph at Doney Park, 68 mph at Winslow, and 70 mph at Two Guns. The cold front moved across the state late on the 9th, and rain changed to snow over the higher terrain. Accumulations were generally light, with 1-2 inches in the Flagstaff area, 1.5 inches in Show Low, 3 inches near McNary, and 6-11 inches at the Arizona Snowbowl. Daytime highs on Saturday, November 10th and Sunday the 11th were much below normal. Several locations set records for the coldest high temperature for the date, including Prescott at 41 degrees and Navajo National Monument at 31 degrees.
