## **NWS Mission**

Providing weather, water and climate data, forecasts, warnings **and Impact-based Decision Support Services (IDSS)** for the protection of life and property and enhancement of the national economy.

## **NWS Vision**

A Weather-Ready Nation: Society is prepared for and responds to extreme weather, water and climate events. "Ready, Responsive, Resilient" through the provision of IDSS

NWS runs 168operational units,most of them 24/7

NWS has **~4450** employees, of whom **86%** are in the field NWS issues ~1.5 million forecasts and ~50,000 warnings each year NWS costs each person in the country about **\$4.00**/year

# **About NWS Houston/Galveston:**

The National Weather Service Forecast Office in League City, Texas is one of 122 local offices that provide forecasts, warnings and decision support services across the United States. NWS Houston/Galveston covers 23 counties in southeast TX and the adjacent coastal waters. The office operates with 23 people when fully staffed, including 13 meteorologists who work 24/7/365 to provide a constant weather watch, and serves a population of over 7.5 million with some of the busiest ports in the country.

### Forecasts / Warnings

impacts from weather and water

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### Marine / Ports

→ 4 major ports (Houston, Galveston, Texas City, Freeport); \$1+ trillion in economic impact

- $\rightarrow$  Largest petrochemical complex
- in nation and 2<sup>nd</sup> largest in world
- $\rightarrow$  7 cruise ships out of Galveston
- (1-2M passengers per year)
- $\rightarrow$  Top 6 in the U.S. for registered
- recreational boats annually
- $\rightarrow$  7 million visitors to area beaches each year



#### Aviation


→ 8 frequent forecasts for area airports (TAFs), including 2 international airports
→ IAH and HOU airports handled ~54 million passengers in 2022.
→ Ellington Airport - supports the operations of the U.S. military, NASA, and other aviation tenants
→ CWSU Houston (ZHU) located at FAA ARTCC at IAH; Small team of 4 meteorologists imbedded with FAA



### HAZMAT / Wildfire

→ On-demand Site-specific
SPOT weather forecasts for
industrial hazmat incidents,
prescribed burns and wildfires
→ Detailed plume forecasts for
hazmat releases and smoke
→ Onsite, direct support
→ Daily Fire Weather Forecasts

for planning prescribed burns  $\rightarrow$  **Provide weather training/ education** to firefighters and fire managers for TX



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### Hydrology

- $\rightarrow$  200+ flood warning sensors
- $\rightarrow$  70 river forecast points
- $\rightarrow$  13 coastal flood gauges  $\rightarrow$  9 reservoirs

→ One of first NWS offices with flood inundation mapping services

1 NEXRAD WSR-88D Radar,
11 ASOS Surface Weather
