The month was predominantly dry and much warmer than normal. In fact, it was the hottest July ever in Fresno since records began there in the late 1800's. A strong and persistent upper level ridge of high pressure anchored over the Great Basin dominated the weather pattern across California. From the 20^{th} through the 23^{rd} , an influx of monsoonal moisture produced isolated afternoon and early evening thunderstorms over the higher elevations. During the early evening hours of the 21^{st} , a nearly stationary thunderstorm complex produced torrential rain and localized flash flooding above Huntington Lake in the vicinity of Rancheria campground. Although a portion of highway 168 was closed because of high water, the flood danger was minimized upon prompt evacuation of campers and tourists by emergency officials.

All mainstem rivers remained below their respective monitor stages through the month.
