WORST IN DOZEN YEARS

Deep Snow and Coldest Weather Since February, 1899.

FIVE TO TEN INCHES.

Mercury Gets Down to 10 A-bove Zero at Fayetteville, WithNearly Five Inches of Snow—Colder and More Snow in Other Places in North Car-olina and Elsewhere.

Within the past week this sec-tion has been visited by the cold-est weather and the deepest snow seen here in ten years or more. Not since Febuarry, 1899, has the Not since February, 1899, has the temperature been as low as it was Saturday, when it reached down to 10 degrees above zero, having fallen from 30 within 24 hours. For forteen horus prior to Saturday night snow fell steadily, forming a depth of something like five inches. In February, 18-99 the mercury reached five de-99, the mercury reached five degrees below zero, it is said, but not since then had it been so low as the point reached Saturday. The snow began Friday night. Saturday morning there was already on the ground what would pass for a big snow in this locality, but the end was not yet. All day long and into Saturday night it snowed continuously, sometimes moderating somewhat, then more heavily, while a stiff stinging wind blew from the north. After nightfall 99, the mercury reached five from the north. After nightfall it ceased and by ordinary bed time the sky was clear. The snow was of the fine, fluffy, flakey, variety, light as feathers. Sunday the temperature rose and that night was much more comforta-ble than either Friday or Sat-urday nights, which were the bitterest nights experienced here in years.

Such a snow, being entirely unusual, was altogether unexpected, and many were found unprepared for it, who might have prepared by laying in a supply of fuel and provisions, covering, etc., fuel and provisions, covering, etc., if they had anticipated such weather. But, as in all cities there were those in Fayetteville who were unable to prepare to keep comfortable through such weather even if they had had ample warning. So the Fayette-ville Chamber of Commerce held a called meeting at four o'clock Saturday afternoon and took steps to provide fuel for those in distress from poverty, and in distress from poverty, and during the day Sunday wagons were busy delivering coal to those in need.

The entire eastern and middle sections of North Carolina were covered in snow, but it seems to have been deeper near the coast than in the Piedmont region. The than in the Piedmont region. The cold wave extended over the entire South east of the Mississippi river, while the North Atlantic states were in the grip of extreme cold, local snows visited the Lake region and rain and snow covered the entire South Atlantic States region. Atlantic States region.

Many states experienced many states experienced the heaviest snow fall of a dozen years. The only state in the east-ern half of the South exempted was Florida. A counter disturb-ance over central Florida pre-vented the cold wave from entering the peninsula, and little damage to fruit and vegetabes there is expected.

At Wilmington an eight-inch fall of snow was reported.

Newton was practically out off from the outside world. Concord had the heaviest snow

in years.
