...TROPICAL STORM DANNY FORMS IN THE SOUTHEAST GULF OF MEXICO...

GALE WARNINGS AND A HURRICANE WATCH ARE IN EFFECT AT 500 PM CDT THIS AFTERNOON FROM EAST OF PORT ARTHUR TO MOBIL BAY. SMALL CRAFT ADVISORIES HAVE BEEN ISSUED FOR THE ENTIRE TEXAS COAST INCLUDING THE OFFSHORE WATERS OFF SABINE PASS TO HIGH ISLAND. SMALL CRAFT SHOULD REMAIN IN PORT ALONG THE UPPER TEXAS COAST.

REPORTS FROM AN AIR FORCE PLANE THIS AFTERNOON INDICATE THE TROPICAL DEPRESSION OFF THE WESTERN COAST OF CUBA HAD STRENGTHENED AS IT MOVED NORTHWEST INTO THE GULF OF MEXICO AND WINDS HAD INCREASED TO 50 MILES AN HOUR.

TROPICAL STORM DANNY IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE TO MOVE TO THE NORTHWEST AT 10 TO 15 MILES AN HOUR AND GRADUALLY STRENGTHEN. IF THIS OCCURES, STORM OR HURRICANE CONDITIONS WILL AFFECT PARTS OF THE LOUISIANA GULF COAST LATE WEDNESDAY OR EARLIER THURSDAY.

THE HIGHEST PROBABILITY FOR LANDFALL THROUGH 100 PM THURSDAY WAS ALONG THE LOUISIANA COAST NEAR THE MISSISSIPPI DELTA.

PORT ARTHUR HAD A VERY LOW PROBABILITY FOR LANDFALL.

AT 500 PM CDT, THE DEVELOPING CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM DANNY WAS LOCATED NEAR LATITUDE 23.5 NORTH, LONGITUDE 87.5 WEST. THIS POSITION WAS ABOUT 580 MILES SOUTHEAST OF PORT ARTHUR, TEXAS.

PERSONS IN THE GOLDEN TRIANGE CAN REST EASY TONIGHT AND REVIEW EMERGENCY CHECKLISTS FOR PREPAREDNESS REQUIRMENTS AFTER WEDNESDAY MORNING.

EVACUATION AND SECURING OF OFFSHORE OIL AND GAS PLATFORMS AND OTHER FACILITIES SHOULD BE COMPLETED BEFORE WINDS AND SEAS BECOME DANGEROUS.

AT 11PM CDT THE HURRICANE WAS LOCATED 225 MILES SOUTHEAST OF FORT ARTHUR TEXAS AT LATITUDE 27.4 NORTH AND LONGITUDE 91.6 WEST. THE HURRICANE WAS MOVING NORTH NORTH WEST AT 13 MILES AN HOUR. DANNY REMAINS A MINIMUM HURRICANE WITH 75 MILE AN HOUR WINDS.

THE LATEST FORECAST STORM TRACK HAS SHIFTED EASTWARD THIS EVENING WITH THE HIGHEST PROBABILITY OF THE CENTER MAKING LANDFALL NEAR NEW IBERIA, LOUISIANA ABOUT NOON THURSDAY.

EARLIER TODAY SABINE PASS WAS ADVISED TO EVACUATE. THE JEFFERSON COUNTY AND FORT ARTHUR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT OFFICIALS HAVE OPENED SHELTERS AT 648 WACO AVENUE..3145 25TH STREET..AND THE DE QUEEN SCHOOL AT 7TH STREET AND DE QUEEN BLVD ALL IN FORT ARTHUR.

THE TIDES HAVE REMAINED 1 TO 1 1/2 FEET ABOVE NORMAL AT SABINE WITH THE NEXT HIGH TIDE EXPECTED AT 5AM CDT. SOME DEBRIS SHOULD BE EXPECTED ON THE BEACH ROAD.. HIGHWAY 87.. IN THE MORNING. THE 8 AM CDT ADVISORY FOR HURRICANE DANNY LOCATED THE CENTER OF THE STORM JUST OFF THE LOUISIANA COAST NEAR LAKE CHARLES.
