...TROPICAL DEPRESSION FORMS IN THE NORTHWEST CARIBBEAN...

AN AIR FORCE RECONNAISSANCE AIRCRAFT FOUND THAT A TROPICAL DEPRESSION HAS FORMED WEST OF GRAND CAYMAN ISLAND IN THE NORTHWEST CARIBBEAN SEA.

AT 6 AM EDT...1000Z...THE CENTER OF THE TROPICAL DEPRESSION WAS LOCATED ABOUT 75 MILES...120 KM...WEST OF GRAND CAYMAN ISLAND. THE DEPRESSION IS MOVING TOWARD THE WEST NORTHWEST AT 12 MPH... 20 KM/HR...AND THIS MOTION IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE FOR THE NEXT 12 TO 24 HOURS.

MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS ARE NEAR 30 MPH...48 KM/HR. CONDITIONS ARE FAVORABLE FOR STRENGTHENING AND THE DEPRESSION COULD BECOME A TROPICAL STORM LATER TODAY. THEREFORE INTERESTS IN THE EXTREME NORTHWEST CARIBBEAN SHOULD CLOSELY MONITOR FUTURE ADVISORIES AND SMALL CRAFT ALONG WESTERN CUBA AND THE EASTERN YUCATAN PENINSULA SHOULD NOT VENTURE FAR FROM PORT.

THE NEXT ADVISORY WILL BE ISSUED BY THE NATIONAL HURRICANE CENTER AT NOON EDT.

REPORTS FROM AN AIR FORCE PLANE SHOW THAT THE DEPRESSION IN THE NORTHWEST CARIBBEAN SEA CHANGED LITTLE DURING THE MORNING... EVEN THOUGH ATMOSPHERIC CONDITIONS REMAIN VERY FAVORABLE FOR STRENGTHENING. THE SYSTEM COULD BECOME A STORM THIS AFTERNOON OR EVENING AND ALL INTERESTS AROUND THE EXTREME NORTHWESTERN CARIBBEAN SHOULD CLOSELY MONITOR FUTURE RELEASES ON THIS SYSTEM.

AT NOON EDT...1600Z...THE BROAD DISORGANIZED CENTER OF THE DEPRESSION WAS LOCATED ABOUT 50 MILES...80 KM...SOUTH OF THE ISLE OF PINES OR 190 MILES...305 KM SOUTH SOUTHWEST OF HAVANA CUBA.

THE DEPRESSION IS MOVING TOWARD THE WEST NORTHWEST AT 12 MPH... 20 KM/HR...AND THIS MOTION IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE FOR THE NEXT 12 TO 24 HOURS.

MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS ARE NEAR 30 MPH...48 KM/HR.

SMALL CRAFT AROUND THE EXTREME NORTHWESTERN CARIBBEAN SEA SHOULD NOT VENTURE FAR FROM PORT.

ATMOSPHERIC CONDITIONS REMAIN VERY FAVORABLE FOR STRENGTHENING AND THE SYSTEM COULD BECOME A STORM TONIGHT OR TUESDAY.

ALL INTERESTS AROUND THE EXTREME NORTHWESTERN CARIBBEAN SHOULD CLOSELY MONITOR THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF THIS DEPRESSION.

AT 6 PM EDT...2200Z...THE BROAD DISORGANIZED CENTER OF THE DEPRESSION WAS LOCATED JUST SOUTH OF THE WESTERN TIP OF CUBA IN THE VICINITY OF THE ISLE OF PINES ABOUT 150 MILES...240 KM...SOUTHWEST OF HAVANA.

THE DEPRESSION IS MOVING TOWARD THE NORTHWEST AT 12 MPH... 20 KM/HR...AND THIS MOTION IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE FOR THE NEXT 12 TO 24 HOURS.

MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS REMAIN NEAR 30 MPH...48 KM/HR.

SMALL CRAFT AROUND THE EXTREME NORTHWESTERN CARIBBEAN SEA AND IN THE LOWER AND MIDDLE KEYS SHOULD NOT VENTURE FAR FROM PORT.

REPORTS FROM AN AIR FORCE PLANE SHOW THAT THE DEPRESSION IN THE NORTHWEST CARIBBEAN SEA CONTINUES TO MOVE TOWARD THE NORTHWEST NEAR 10 MPH. AT 1030 PM EDT...0230Z...THE BROAD DIFFUSE CENTER WAS LOCATED NEAR THE SOUTHWEST COAST OF CUBA ABOUT 170 MILES SOUTHWEST OF HAVANA. LITTLE CHANGE IN STRENGTH HAS TAKEN PLACE THIS EVENING WITH MUCH OF THE SYSTEM OVER WESTERN CUBA. HOWEVER... ATMOSPHERIC CONDITIONS ARE FAVORABLE FOR STRENGTHENING AND THE SYSTEM COULD REACH TROPICAL STORM STRENGTH AT ANY TIME. FURTHER STRENGTHENING IS LIKELY TOMORROW AS THE SYSTEM MOVES INTO THE SOUTHEAST GULF OF MEXICO.

MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS REMAIN NEAR 30 MPH...48 KM/HR...WITH HIGHER GUSTS IN SQUALLS. SOME HEAVY RAINS ARE LIKELY OVER WESTERN CUBA.

ALL INTERESTS AROUND THE EXTREME NORTHWEST CARIBBEAN AND THE LOWER FLORIDA KEYS SHOULD CLOSELY MONITOR THE FUTURE PROGRESS OF THIS SYSTEM. SMALL CRAFT IN THOSE AREAS SHOULD NOT VENTURE FAR FROM PORT.

REPORTS FROM AN AIR FORCE PLANE AND SATELLITE PICTURES INDICATE THAT THE CENTER OF THE DEPRESSION PASSED OVER THE EXTREME WESTERN TIP OF CUBA DURING THE NIGHT AND IS NOW EMERGING JUST OFF THE COAST INTO THE SOUTHEASTERN GULF OF MEXICO. CONDITIONS REMAIN VERY FAVORABLE FOR STRENGTHENING AND THE SYSTEM COULD BECOME A STORM OVER THE WARM GULF WATERS TODAY. ALL INTERESTS AROUND THE SOUTHEASTERN GULF OF MEXICO SHOULD CLOSELY MONITOR THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF THIS DEPRESSION.

AT 6 AM EDT...1000Z...THE BROAD DISORGANIZED CENTER OF THE DEPRESSION WAS LOCATED JUST NORTH OF THE WESTERN TIP OF CUBA ABOUT 160 MILES WEST SOUTHWEST OF HAVANA CUBA.

THE DEPRESSION IS MOVING TOWARD THE NORTHWEST AT 12 MPH...20 KM/HR AND THIS MOTION IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE FOR THE NEXT 12 TO 24 HOURS.

MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS ARE NEAR 35 MPH...56 KM/HR...WITH HIGHER GUSTS IN SQUALLS. SOME HEAVY RAINS ARE LIKELY OVER WESTERN CUBA.

SMALL CRAFT AROUND THE SOUTHEASTERN GULF OF MEXICO INCLUDING THE LOWER KEYS SHOULD NOT VENTURE FAR FROM PORT.

SATELLITE PICTURES THIS MORNING SHOW THAT THE DEPRESSION IN THE EXTREME SOUTHEASTERN GULF OF MEXICO IS STILL VERY DISORGANIZED AND THE EXPECTED STRENGTHENING HAS BEEN DELAYED. AIR FORCE PLANES WILL MONITOR THE SYSTEM TODAY AND WATCH FOR SIGNS OF INCREASING WINDS. ALL INTERESTS AROUND THE SOUTHEASTERN GULF OF MEXICO SHOULD CLOSELY MONITOR THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF THIS SYSTEM.

AT NOON EDT...1600Z...THE BROAD AREA OF LIGHT WINDS DEFINING THE CENTER OF THE DEPRESSION WAS LOCATED OFF THE WESTERN TIP OF CUBA.

THE DEPRESSION IS MOVING TOWARD THE NORTHWEST AT 12 MPH...20 KM/HR AND THIS MOTION IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE FOR THE NEXT 12 TO 24 HOURS.

MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS ARE NEAR 35 MPH...56 KM/HR...WITH HIGHER GUSTS IN SQUALLS MAINLY EAST OF THE CENTER. LOCALLY HEAVY RAINS OVER WESTERN CUBA SHOULD DECREASE DURING THE AFTERNOON.

SMALL CRAFT AROUND THE SOUTHEASTERN GULF OF MEXICO INCLUDING THE LOWER KEYS SHOULD NOT VENTURE FAR FROM PORT.

AIR FORCE RECONNAISSANCE FOUND 45 TO 50 MPH WINDS IN SQUALLS WELL NORTH OF THE CENTER OF THE DEPRESSION. BUT THE LOWEST PRESSURE FOUND IN THE DEPRESSION WAS ONLY 1012 MB AND THIS NORMALLY DOES NOT SUPPORT A SUSTAINED WIND OF 50 MPH.

THE NATIONAL HURRICANE CENTER WILL CONTINUE TO MONITOR REPORTS FROM AIR FORCE RECONNAISSANCE THIS AFTERNOON TO SEE IF THE SYSTEM SHOULD BE UPGRADED TO A TROPICAL STORM AT 6 PM EDT THIS EVENING.

GALE WARNING AND A HURRICANE WATCH ARE IN EFFECT AT 5 PM CDT FROM EAST OF PORT ARTHUR TEXAS TO AND INCLUDING MOBILE.

REPORTS FROM A AIR FORCE PLANE THIS AFTNOON INDICATE THE DEPRESSION IN THE SOUTHEASTERN GULF OF MEXICO HAS STRENGTHENED AND WINDS ARE NOW 50 MPH...THUS THE SYSTEM HAS BEEN UPGRADED TO TROPICAL STORM DANNY.

THE STORM IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE MOVING TOWARDS THE NORTHWEST 10 TO 15 MPH AND GRADUALLY STRENGTHEN. IF THIS OCCURS STORM OR HURRICANE CONDITIONS WILL AFFECT PORTIONS OF THE NORTH GULF COAST LATE WEDNESDAY OR EARLY THURSDAY.
