H. PRELIMINARY STORM EFFECTS...

TORNADO INJURIES...NONE KNOWN.

PEOPLE EVACUATED...VOLUNTARY EVACUATIONS FROM THE WEST END OF

GALVESTON ISLAND AND BOLIVAR PENINSULA.

DEATHS...THREE CONFIRMED...A 24 YEAR OLD U.S. COAST GUARD SEAMAN AND HIS TWO YEAR OLD DAUGHTER. BOTH WERE FOUND NEAR 61ST STREET PIER SUNDAY NIGHT 10/16/89 UTC (10/15/89 CDT). THE TRUCK THEY WERE RIDING IN WAS FOUND ABOUT 20 BLOCKS AWAY IN THE GULF OF MEXICO. THE THIRD WAS THE APPARENT OWNER AND DRIVER OF THE ABOVE MENTIONED TRUCK...ALSO A COAST GUARD SEAMAN, AGE 19.

STORM INJURIES...SEVERAL PEOPLE INJURED FROM FLYING GLASS. IN ADDITION, ONE PERSON REPORTED SUFFERING A HEART ATTACK AND ANOTHER SUSTAINING A BROKEN LEG DUE TO BEING STRUCK BY A FALLING TREE.
