

Severe Storms Possible Today

Additional Strong or Severe Storms Possible Wednesday and Thursday

Key Messages

- Isolated non-severe storms this morning \rightarrow
- Main chance of severe storms this afternoon and \rightarrow evening
- Damaging wind is the main threat, with hail and \rightarrow an isolated tornado secondary threats
- Most likely timing is 2-10 PM EDT. \rightarrow

Impacts

- Pockets of damaging wind could cause \rightarrow structural damage and/or tree damage
- Lightning will threaten outdoor activities \rightarrow
- Heavy rainfall could cause brief localized \rightarrow flooding concerns



Strong Storms/Heavy Rain Possible Wednesday

Localized Flash Flooding Threat May Develop Along Front

Key Messages

- Storms moving over the same area could \rightarrow cause localized minor flooding concerns.
- Strong and severe storms possible. Gusty \rightarrow winds would be the main threat with a very limited window for an isolated tornado.

Impacts

- Lightning will threaten outdoor activities in some areas.
- Heavy rainfall could cause brief localized \rightarrow flooding concerns, mainly ponding of water on roadways.



Strong Storms/Heavy Rain Possible Thursday

Locally Heavy Rain Possible

Key Messages

- Showers and storms are expected to develop to \rightarrow our west and then move into our area ahead of a cold front
- A few strong or severe storms with gusty winds and small hail are possible
- Will likely come through in multiple waves \rightarrow throughout the day

Impacts

- Gusty winds could cause loose outdoor items like tents or signage to blow around
- Lightning will threaten outdoor activities \rightarrow
- Heavy rainfall could cause localized flooding \rightarrow concerns including ponding of water on roadways




Any storm that contains at least one of the following:
