Subject: Change to flood impact categories on the East Branch DuPage River at Bolingbrook, Illinois

Effective January 20, 2021, flood impact categories for the East Branch DuPage River at Bolingbrook, Illinois, (NWS identifier BOLI2) will change. Flood impact categories are set for this gauge based upon the river reach extending from approximately Maple Avenue in Lisle downstream to the confluence with the West Branch DuPage River. These changes were coordinated with representatives from the DuPage County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, the Will County Emergency Management Agency, the village of Bolingbrook, the village of Woodridge, and the city of Naperville.

Action stage will remain unchanged at 18.0 feet. Minor flood stage will change from 19.5 feet to 20.0 feet. Moderate flood stage will change from 21.0 feet to 22.0 feet. Major flood stage will change from 23.0 feet to 24.0 feet. River forecasts will be issued when this location has reached, or is expected to reach, action stage.
