Weather Summary

Actual date unknown. The water rose twelve feet above flood stage above the usual high-water mark, and caused great destruction. It reached the second story of some of the houses built on the low ground at South Trenton. Inmates were rescued by people from the Bucks county shore in canoes and conveyed to this side. Several houses were carried away, two persons and a number of cattle drowned and the shore of the river was strewn with household goods. This freshet was known as "the great flood at Delaware Falls." MARFC estimates a crest of 29.80 feet.
