Weather Summary

As a high pressure system moved towards the Great Lakes, coming in from Canada between the 2nd and 3rd, a nearly stationary front extending from the South Central states towards the Mid-Atlantic region moved slowly bringing some rain over the state of Pennsylvania. The showers from this stationary front resulted minor flooding in Langhorne, PA. Precipitation amount were approximately 0.11 on the 2nd and a trace on the 3rd.
