## **Weather Summary**

Heavy rain producing thunderstorms trudged through the state of Virginia at a slow pace during the week of 6/25 through 7/1. They worked in conjunction with deep low-level moisture from the tropics, a strong stalled front, and an upper-level disturbance to create heavy downpours in areas already or nearly saturated with water. Throughout the day on June 27th, Madison County experienced the most severe flooding with rainfall exceeding 20 inches in 12 hours at high elevations. Rainfall in many of the counties in the Rappahannock and James Basins received rainfall amounts of at least 10 inches. During the evening, more heavy rains sprang up bringing more flooding to the already flooded counties of Augusta, Albemarle, and Nelson. Many roads, businesses, railroads and farm lands were severely damaged costing millions of dollars in damage.
