Weather Summary

Tropical Storm Bill made landfall in Louisiana on June 30th. Bill reached a maximum intensity just before landfall, packing winds of 60mph. Although quickly became a Depression as it moved northward into the Mid-Atlantic States, Bill held onto its tropical characteristics for a few days until it began to interact with a frontal system on the 2nd. The remnants of Bill continued to move northward through Virginia until it was completely absorbed by the front on the 3rd. The low eventually continued northeastward until it pushed into the Atlantic Ocean. The remnants of Bill dumped over an inch of rain across much of Virginia and Maryland. Three to five inches of rain were reported in Central Virginia which caused minor flooding in the James and Appomattox Basins.
