A powerful cold front pulling eastward across the northern Plains and into the Mid Atlantic allowed for the formation of heavy-rain producing thunderstorms to roll across Pennsylvania and provide high local precipitation totals particularly over the Lower Main Stem of the Susquehanna. Between the evening of July 31 and morning hours of August 1, rain poured over south-central PA resulting in totals above 3 inches where, specifically, Harrisburg, PA received 2.44 inches between 3 and 5 AM August 1.
