Weather Summary

A warm front followed by a cold front moved slowly across the Mid-Atlantic region. A couple of weak waves ran northeast along the cold front and brought additional periods of rain and a few thunderstorms. One to three inches of rain was common on the 24th and early 25th. Sharp rises occurred along some of our smaller streams and creeks with Langhorne, Pennsylvania rising 6 feet in less than six hours.
