Widespread moderate to major coastal flooding from storm surge along the length of the Collier County coast. The first flooding episode of up to moderate levels occurred with the high tide on the morning and midday of September 26th when the initial storm surge from Helene reached the area. The subsequent low tide was muted by increasing surge from the major hurricane, with the highest and most impactful flooding occurring during the evening/night high tide cycle of September 26th and early morning of September 27th.

NWS surveys indicated that the storm surge easily overtopped dunes at the Naples area beaches, reaching an estimated 3-4 feet above ground in adjacent streets and parking lots. Sand was piled up a few feet deep along Gordon Drive in Naples and Gulf Shore Drive in Vanderbilt Beach. Water entered several structures along the Intracoastal Waterway in Vanderbilt Beach, the north end of Naples Bay, and the Bayshore Drive corridor of East Naples.

In Marco Island, Goodland, Everglades City, and Chokoloskee, inundation was generally in the 1-3 ft range, mainly affecting streets with minor water intrusion into several structures.

Wind damage was primarily to trees, although some weaker structures suffered minor roof damage.
