<p>Two tornadoes over the Everglades with isolated damage observed along I-75/Alligator Alley. See Tornado Summary for more information. Otherwise, minor wind damage, mainly to trees. Power outages resulted in fewer than 4,000 customers without power.</p>			

County Name Collier	Injuries: 0	Fatalities: 0	Evacuations: 2,900
<p>Moderate to major coastal flooding along most of the Collier County coast, mainly on October 9th from late morning through the overnight. Inundation above ground was in the 2-4 foot range across much of the beach and bayfront locations across the county, with a maximum estimated inundation of near 5 feet in Chokoloskee. General tree and power line damage was observed across a good portion of the county. One tornado skirted the far NE corner of the county just south of Big Cypress Seminole Reservation with isolated damage along Alligator Alley. See Tornado Summary for more information. An estimated 85% of customers lost power in Collier County. Property damage estimated at \$280 million. A total of 88 structures incurred major damage, with 224 seeing minor damage.</p>

<p>Most substantial structural and tree damage associated with 4 tornadoes which impacted central and eastern portions of the county. See Tornado Summary for more information. A total of 54 structures were damaged, with 27 uninhabitable and considered destroyed, mainly in the Lakeport area. Other damage was surveyed in the Brighton Seminole Indian Reservation. Approximately 1,700 customers lost power.</p>

Otherwise, minor wind damage, mainly to trees. Additional damage information will be provided in future updates. Power outages resulted in fewer than 4,000 customers without power.

Most substantial structural and tree damage associated with 3 tornadoes which impacted western portions of the county. See Tornado Summary for more information. Tree damage and downed power lines at many locations, mainly in North County, western communities, and near Lake Okeechobee.

From tornado damage assessment in Palm Beach Gardens: 12 structures destroyed, 48 with major damage, 152 with minor damage. Total estimated damage cost is \$45.23 million.

From tornado damage assessment in Wellington: 1 structure destroyed, 20 with major damage, 59 with minor damage. Total estimated damage cost is \$27.1 million.

From tornado damage assessment in Loxahatchee Groves: 2 structures destroyed, 2 with major damage, 17 with minor damage. Total estimated damage cost is \$1.97 million.

In unincorporated Palm Beach County: 5 structures with major damage, 18 with minor damage. Total estimated damage cost is \$6.79 million.

Countywide, estimated damage cost is \$81.35 million.
