UNIVERSAL TIME /UTC//...THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE FORECAST OFFICE IN
FAIRBANKS WILL BEGIN ISSUING THEIR PREVIOUS SEASONAL DENALI PARK FORECAST
UNDER A NEW MASS NEWS DISSEMINATOR /MND/ AS MOUNT MCKINLEY RECREATIONAL
FORECAST. THE WORLD METEOROLOGICAL ORGANIZATION /WMO/ HEADER FPAK18
PAFA...ADVANCED WEATHER INTERACTIVE PROCESSING SYSTEM /AWIPS/ ID
RECFAI...AND PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION LIST /PIL/ ID FAIRECFAI WILL REMAIN
THE SAME.

FAHRENHEIT.

SYNOPSIS. A WEATHER FRONT IS APPROACHING FROM THE EAST. IT WILL MOVE
THROUGH THIS EVENING. A NOTHER FRONT WILL APPROACH ON WEDNESDAY FROM THE
SOUTHEAST AND MOVE OUT THURSDAY.

...14000 FT AND BELOW...WIND SPEEDS ARE LIGHT UNLESS NOTED...

.MONDAY...INCREASING CLOUDS. HIGH AT 7000 FT...45 ABOVE. HIGH AT 14000

FT...32 ABOVE.

.MONDAY NIGHT...CLOUDY. UP TO 6 INCHES OF SNOW. LOW AT 7000 FT...20 ABOVE. LOW AT 14000 FT...5 ABOVE.

.TUESDAY...CLEARING. A CHANCE OF SNOW SHOWERS IN THE MORNING. HIGH AT 7000 FT...45 ABOVE. HIGH AT 14000 FT...30 ABOVE.

...ABOVE 14000 FT...

.MONDAY...MOSTLY CLOUDY. HIGH AT 17000 FT...10 ABOVE. WINDS FROM 17000 FT TO THE SUMMIT...EAST 20 MPH WITH GUSTS TO 35 MPH.

.MONDAY NIGHT...UP TO 6 INCHES OF SNOW. LOW AT 17000 FT...10 BELOW. WINDS FROM 17000 FT TO THE SUMMIT...EAST 25 TO 35 MPH WITH GUSTS TO 60 MPH.

.TUESDAY...SUNNY. HIGH AT 17,000 FT...10 ABOVE. WINDS FROM 17000 FT TO THE SUMMIT...SOUTHEAST 15 TO 25 MPH WITH GUSTS TO 40 MPH.

.OUTLOOK WEDNESDAY THROUGH FRIDAY...WIND INCREASING TO 40 MPH WITH GUSTS 70 MPH WEDNESDAY. WIND GUSTS DIMINISHING BELOW 30 MPH THURSDAY. WINDS 20 MPH OR LESS FRIDAY. SNOW LIKELY WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY.
