/EDT/...0900 COORDINATED UNIVERSAL TIME /UTC/...A NEW 5-DAY STATE FORECAST  
PRODUCT /SFP/ WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR THE UPPER PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN. THIS  
NARRATIVE PRODUCT WILL BE ISSUED TWICE EACH DAY AROUND 5 A.M. AND 5 P.M.  
LOCAL TIME...PROVIDING A GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF EXPECTED WEATHER  
CONDITIONS ACROSS THE UPPER PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN. THE UPPER PENINSULA OF  
MICHIGAN INCLUDES PUBLIC FORECAST ZONES MIZ001 THROUGH MIZ015...MIZ084 AND

TO THE LOWER 80S FAR SOUTH.  
.WEDNESDAY NIGHT...PARTLY CLOUDY. A CHANCE OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS  
MAINLY AFTER MIDNIGHT. LOWS IN THE MID 50S TO LOWER 60S.
