Heavy Rain/Flash Flooding

- Storm Total Rainfall: 1 to 2 inches. Localized amounts up to 3 inches.
- Rainfall Rates: As high as 1 to 1½ inches per hour.
- **Timing:** This afternoon thru Saturday afternoon.
- Flash Flooding: Isolated to scattered instances of flash flooding of urban, poor drainage, and low-lying areas possible.
- River/Stream Flooding: Minor flooding along quick responding small rivers, streams, creeks and adjacent roads and properties is possible. Flooding along larger stem rivers is not expected.

FORECAST CHALLENGES


- There is moderate/high confidence in showers and thunderstorms developing, but there remains some uncertainty on the exact placement of the axis of heaviest rainfall.
- An expansion of the Flood Watch into the rest of southern Connecticut may be needed should the expected axis of heaviest rainfall spread eastward.


