# Severe Weather Risk Friday/Friday night

March 13, 2025 3:40 PM

Second round of severe weather is possible Saturday across mainly west Kentucky and southwest Indiana

## **Key Messages**

- Potential for a significant line of severe storms to produce <u>damaging winds</u>, <u>large hail</u> and <u>tornadoes</u> as it moves east across the entire Quad State late Friday afternoon into the early morning hours Saturday.
- Storms will be fast moving, possibly up to 70mph.
- South winds expected to gust to 40-50 mph ahead storms Friday afternoon and evening.
- More severe storms and heavy rain are possible Saturday mainly over west Kentucky and southwest Indiana.



# Potential Hazards for Friday

**Moderate (Level 4 of 5) Risk of Severe Thunderstorms** 

### **Key Messages**

- → Some uncertainty remains with moisture/instability.
- → Potential exists for significant severe weather with hurricane force winds and EF-2 or greater tornadoes.

## **Timing**


→ Late Friday afternoon through the early morning Saturday.

### **Primary Hazards**

- → Widespread damaging winds
- → Large hail
- → Tornadoes

### **Uncertainty**

- → The location of initial development.
- → A lack of robust low-level moisture could be a limiting factor.



Friday evening/night Tornado Potential











## Maximum Wind Gusts Friday afternoon/Friday Evening

#### Max Forecast Gusts Friday






# Thunderstorm Outlook for Saturday

Slight Risk (Level 2 of 5) of Severe Weather West Kentucky and Southwest Indiana

### **Key Messages**

- → A final round of thunderstorms will stream northeastward across west Kentucky and southwest Indiana Saturday afternoon and evening.
- → Isolated to scattered severe thunderstorms are possible, but it will depend in part on how the storms evolve Friday night.
- → Damaging winds, large hail, and tornadoes will be the main severe weather hazards.
- → Heavy rainfall is a bigger concern for Saturday. Flash flooding is possible.
- → Expect the outlook to evolve with time.






# **Approximate Severe Weather Timing Saturday**

Main concerns with storms are again damaging winds, large hail, and tornadoes.




# Forecast Total Rainfall late Friday through Saturday night

Friday amounts may trend lower with time

## **Highlights**

- Most places will likely receive about one inch or less with the line of storms Friday afternoon and night.
- The heaviest rain will be over west Kentucky Saturday afternoon and evening. 1 to 3 inch amounts are possible. Flash flooding may develop.





# **Outlook Meaning**


Level 4 of 5

Last Moderate was May 26, 2024, a very high impact event

Previous to that date was March 31, 2023, and that event that was very high impact but largely spared the quad-state

This was also the last Moderate issued two days in advance, which is quite uncommon

Be alert - prepare to adjust plans accordingly
