A mandatory evacuation was issued for barrier islands, low lying and flood-prone areas, and RV parks. There were minimal impacts to the county aside from a few small trees and power lines down.

Leon County Schools opened six evacuation centers. 102 trees were reported downed impacting 51 power lines across the county. This resulted in power outages for more than 55,000 customers. There was minimal damage to structures. FSU reported only minor damage to small trees with some branches down.

A trained spotter southwest of Madison recorded 8.71 inches of rain and estimated winds of 75 mph gusting to 90 mph. Widespread flooding was reported across the county. Flooding across southeast portions of the county corresponded with a 500-year flood event. Some water rescues resulted. Numerous roads closed in the southeastern portion of the county due to flooding. Homes were inundated with flood waters on St. Augustine Rd and Kayak St. Several businesses were affected by flooding including Ragans Campground and Madison Country Club. More than 100 homes were damaged from either wind or flooding. Downed trees and power lines resulted in temporary road closures and extended power outages. Power outages lasted up to 3 to 4 days. As of August 20th, flooding continues in southeastern Madison County, where water levels continue to gradually rise east of Lee and areas around US 90 as well as areas south of I-10 east of State Road 53. Flood waters in southeastern Madison County are continuing to gradually shift slowly south and east toward the Suwannee River, which remains in flood as of August 20th. Flooding also occurred along portions of the Aucilla, Fenholloway, Steinhatchee and Withlacoochee rivers. Tropical storm force winds als

People who felt their shelter was inadequate or who had life-sustaining medical equipment that required electricity and had nowhere else to go were invited to a community shelter. About 34,000 residents lost power due to numerous downed trees and power lines across the county. Valdosta State University had 6 buildings with water damage due to leaking roofs, and one from a tree falling on the building. The Parks and Recreation Authority had a tree cause extensive roof damage to their main office which also resulted in water damage from rain coming in. Four other residences reported flooding. Total estimated damage is \$1 million.
