32-38	28-33	Very Strong Wind	Trees in motion. Light-weight loose objects (e.g., lawn furniture) tossed or toppled. Walking becomes difficult.	
39-49	34-42	Gale Force	Small trees bend; twigs and small branches/limbs < 2" in diameter may break off trees.

Roof may be partially peeled off industrial/commercial/warehouse buildings. Some minor roof damage to homes. Weak structures (e.g., farm buildings, airplane hangers) may be severely damaged.	
90 +	78 +	Destructive Wind	Many large trees snapped or uprooted. Mobile homes severely damaged; moderate to severe roof damage to homes. Moving automobiles pushed off dry roads. Barns, sheds demolished.
